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1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "National Children's3 Museum Act".

4 SEC. 2. NATIONAL CHILDREN'S MUSEUM.

5 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—

6 (1) the Museum and Library Services Act of 7 2003 (Public Law 108–81) designated the Capital 8 Children's Museum, the predecessor to the National 9 Children's Museum, as the "National Children's Mu-10 seum";

(2) the National Children's Museum operates
under section 501(C)(3) of the Internal Revenue
Code of 1986 and is organized under the laws of the
District of Columbia;

(3) the mission of the National Children's Museum is to inspire children to care about and change
the world; and

(4) the National Children's Museum is located
in the federally owned Ronald Reagan Building and
International Trade Center.

(b) NATIONAL CHILDREN'S MUSEUM.—Chapter 67
of title 40, United States Code, is amended by adding at
the end the following:

24 "§ 6735. National Children's Museum

25 "(a) IN GENERAL.— Not later than 30 days after
26 the date of enactment of this section, the Administrator

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of General Services shall enter into a cooperative agree-1 2 ment with the National Children's Museum for the operation of the National Children's Museum in the approxi-3 4 mately 32,369 square feet of space commonly known as 5 suite C-001 (hereinafter referred to as the 'Space') of the 6 Ronald Reagan Building and International Trade Center 7 for the duration of the retail space license agreement be-8 tween Trade Center Management Associates, LLC, or a 9 successor entity, and the Museum, dated December 4, 10 2017, including any exercised renewal options.

11 "(b) CONTENTS.—The cooperative agreement under
12 subsection (a) shall include provisions that—

"(1) require, for the period in which the General Services Administration owns or controls the
Space, the General Services Administration to provide rent for the Space;

17 "(2) terminate such agreement if—

18 "(A) the Museum does not continue to
19 qualify as a nonprofit organization under sec20 tion 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of
21 1986; and

22 "(B) the Museum no longer uses the Space23 as a children's museum; and

24 "(3) prohibits the Museum from transferring25 the interest in such agreement.

"(c) SOURCE OF FUNDS.—To carry out this section,
 the Administrator shall use funds derived from—

- 3 "(1) the Pennsylvania Avenue Development
 4 Corporation fund; or
- 5 "(2) the International Trade Center fund.

6 "(d) REPORT.—The cooperative agreement under 7 subsection (a) shall require the National Children's Mu-8 seum to submit to the Committee on Transportation and 9 Infrastructure of the House of Representatives and the 10 Committee on Environment and Public Works of the Sen-11 ate an annual report on the operations and finances of 12 the Museum.".

(c) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The analysis for chapter 67 of title 40, United States Code, is amended by adding at the end the following:

"6735. National Children's Museum.".

16 SEC. 3. DETERMINATION OF BUDGETARY EFFECTS.
